Scope and contents

The collection consists of 26 issues of *The Shemya Mailbag*, a quarterly newsletter published by the Shemya World War II Veterans Association, an organization formed in 1983 by the late Dr. E.B. Bonnet of New Orleans, Louisiana. The newsletter was printed in March, June, September, and December, and the collection contains the issues from June 1987 until September 1993. The purpose of the newsletter was to perpetuate the history of the Shemya and the Aleutian Islands as well as to document the recollections of soldiers who fought and were stationed on the islands during World War II.
