A student may cancel or add a course through September 29. No course may be canceled or added after September 29. *Courses are canceled through the Dean's Office.* A student may drop a course between September 30 and November 5 by obtaining the written permission from the instructor and presenting the approved drop card to the Registrar. A student may withdraw from the College by advising the Dean in writing. Failure to give official notice of withdrawal will result in a grade of "F" in each course for which the student was registered.

PROCEDURE OF REGISTRATION

1. A student's admission credentials must be on file in the Registrar's office before a matriculation card will be issued.
2. The matriculation cards should be filled in completely before they are submitted to instructors for their initials.
3. All women students, whether they live in the dormitory or elsewhere, must have the Dean of Women's notation that place of residence is approved. Her office is on the 3rd floor of the Administration Building.
4. After registration in all courses has been approved by the instructors, the matriculation card must be presented to your major professor and the Dean for approval.
5. After the matriculation card is approved by the Dean, it must be taken to the Bursar's office, where all fees must be paid. Veterans attending under the G.I. Bill of Rights should report to the Veterans Coordinator on the first floor instead of the Bursar.

VETERANS

1. Clear your entrance requirements with the Registrar.
2. Get your matriculation card from the office of the Veterans Coordinator on the first floor.
3. After the Dean has reviewed and approved your program of studies, leave your blue card in the Dean's office, and take your approved matriculation card to Mr. Davis in the Veterans' office.
4. All questions concerning apartments on the campus for veterans should be referred to Dr. R. W. Johnson in Room 108 of the Administration Building.
