All pre-registration must be done during the instructors' office hours.

Registration is not complete until all fees have been paid. You may pay your registration fees any time between March 6 and 11.

NOTE: All students please register according to your classification as of the end of the current quarter; for example, if you have 67 hours at the time of pre-registration and are carrying 15 hours you will register with the juniors.

NOTE: Seniors, juniors, and sophomores who fail to complete their registration during the days allotted to them must wait until Tuesday, March 21. Monday, March 20, is exclusively for freshmen and new students.

A student may cancel or add a course through March 28. No course may be canceled or added after March 28. *Courses are canceled through the Dean's Office.* A student may drop a course between March 29 and April 26 by obtaining the written permission from the instructor and presenting the approved drop card to the Registrar. A student may withdraw from the College by advising the Dean in writing. Failure to give official notice of withdrawal will result in a grade of "F" in each course for which the student was registered.

PROCEDURE OF REGISTRATION

1. A student's admission credentials must be on file in the Registrar's office before a matriculation card will be issued.
2. The matriculation cards should be filled in completely before they are submitted to instructors for their initials.
3. All women students, whether they live in the dormitory or elsewhere, must have the Dean of Women's notation that place of residence is approved. Her office is on the 3rd floor of the Administration Building.
4. After the matriculation card is approved by the Dean, it must be taken to the Bursar's office, where all fees must be paid. Veterans attending under the G.I. Bill of Rights should report to the Veterans Coordinator on the first floor instead of the Bursar.
5. After registration in all courses has been approved by the instructors, the matriculation card must be presented to your major professor and the Dean for approval.

VETERANS

1. Clear your entrance requirements with the Registrar.
2. Get your matriculation card from the office of the Veterans coordinator on the first floor.
3. After the Dean has reviewed and approved your program of studies, leave your blue card in the Dean's office, and take your approved matriculation card to Mr. Davis in the Veterans' office.
4. All questions concerning apartments on the campus for veterans should be referred to Dr. R. W. Johnson in Room 108 of the Administration Building.

Ed. 418 is open only to the student with senior standing who has credit or is enrolled in Ed. 413. The student who plans to enroll in student teaching courses during the Fall Quarter of the 1950-51 school year must have his application approved not later than May 1, 1950, and student teaching hours arranged before registration.
