Regular registration.....\$45.00 for 3 or more courses

Special registration..... 22.00 for 2 or fewer courses

Combination graduate and undergraduate courses will be permitted upon the payment of fees for both the special registration as a graduate student and as an undergraduate student. A student with such combination may elect to pay a fee of \$4.00 per quarter hour for graduate courses in lieu of special registration.

After a graduate student has completed his registration, it cannot be changed without approval of the Director of the Graduate Division. The adjustment will originate in the office of the Director, and the change-of-course must have the approval of the chairmen of the departments of the student's major and minor fields and the Director.

Failure to give official notice of withdrawal will result in a grade of "F" in each course for which the student was registered. Address your notice of withdrawal to the Director.

PROCEDURE OF REGISTRATION

1. A student's admission credentials must be on file in the Registrar's office before a matriculation card will be issued.
2. After registration in all courses has been approved by the instructors, the matriculation card must be presented to the chairmen of the departments in the student's major and minor fields and to the Director of the Graduate Division for approval.
3. After the matriculation card is approved by the Director, it must be taken to the Bursar's office, where all fees must be paid. Registration is not complete until all fees are paid.
