NOTE: All beginning students are requested to meet in the College Auditorium at 9:00 A.M. Wednesday, September 19. This conference is designed to acquaint the new students with the three schools within the College and the several degrees offered, and to explain the procedure of the two-day registration period. Mimeographed instructions will be distributed and discussed. After this conference all students will be directed to THE SCHOOL OF ARTS AND SCIENCES, THE SCHOOL OF EDUCATION, or THE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION, where they will be further advised concerning the specific requirements of the particular school with which they have elected to affiliate.

September 20:	10 to 4	Registration, Freshmen.
September 21:		Classes meet as scheduled.

Note: *Late Registration Fee*—An extra fee of \$1.00 will be charged for *each day* after the first day classes are scheduled to meet.

PROCEDURE OF REGISTRATION

1. A student may cancel a course before it has met the *third* time by obtaining the approval of his advisor.
2. A student may add a course before it has met the *fourth* time by obtaining the approval of his advisor provided he does not exceed the maximum number of hours permitted for that day of the registration period: 18 hrs. through the second day, 15 hrs. through the third day, and 12 hrs. through the fourth day.
3. A student may drop a course before mid-term (Nov. 3) by obtaining a drop card from the instructor and personally presenting it to the director of the school in which he is registered, for approval.
4. A student may withdraw from the college by advising the Dean in writing. Failure to give official notice of withdrawal will result in a grade of "F" in each course for which the student was registered.
5. *All* women students must have the Dean of Women's notation that place of residence is approved.

3. After you have obtained final approval of your registration card return it to the Veterans office.

A student with credit in Education 391 will register a special methods course in a second field of study as Education 392. Education 382 is open only to a student who has not had and is unable to obtain or schedule a methods course in his field of concentration before graduation, and who has arranged for a one-hour conference period each week with the chairman of the department preparing him in his content field. A student with credit in Education 416 or Education 426, will register the second student teaching course as Education 417, or Education 427, respectively; a third course would be registered as Education 418 or Education 428, if at the same grade level of teaching. Education 419 (formerly Education 418) is open only to the student with senior standing who has credit in Education 382, or is enrolled in the course. The student who plans to enroll in student teaching courses during the winter quarter of 1951-52 must have his application approved not later than November 1, 1951—by the Chairman of the Department of Education, the Chairman of the Department concerned with training in the content field, and by the Director of Student Teaching.
