Biographical information

Celia Jane Oakley was born in 1912 in Moline, Rock Island, Illinois, and in 1932 married William Robert Hollingsworth, Jr. (1910-1944), from Jackson, Mississippi, while she was studying design at the School of Art Institute in Chicago and he was studying art. William and Jane moved to Jackson soon after graduation in 1934. He initially worked for the Federal Emergency Relief Agency but then became a full-time painter while Jane became the breadwinner as a clothes designer and maker. They and their son William III lived with William's father. William committed suicide in 1944. Jane Hollingsworth died on April 20, 1986.
