REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

- MARCH 3** —Pick up your registration material from the Registrar or the school with which you are affiliated. Get your advisor's approval of your schedule *before* you go to the Bursar. Those not affiliated with one of the schools get their major professor's approval. The advisors should keep the advisor card.
- MARCH 10** —After getting your schedule approved, pay your fees at the Bursar's office, beginning March 10.
- MARCH 20-21**—Complete registration in Student Center according to the following order:
- March 20— 8:00-10:00—Students whose surnames begin with—G, H, I, J.
- March 20—10:00-12:00—Students whose surnames begin with—T, U, V, W, X, Y, Z.
- March 20— 1:00- 3:00—Students whose surnames begin with—A, B.
- March 21— 8:00-10:00—Students whose surnames begin with—K, L, M, N, O.
- March 21—10:00-12:00—Students whose surnames begin with—C, D, E, F.
- March 21— 1:00- 3:00—Students whose surnames begin with—P, Q, R, S.

After all courses have been approved by your instructors leave your registration cards with the Director of your school or with the Dean. You keep the "student's copy" of the blue card and your bursar's receipt.

March 24—Classes meet as scheduled.

Note: *Late Registration Fee*—An extra fee of \$1.00 will be charged for *each day* after the first day classes are scheduled to meet.

1. A student may cancel or add a course before it has met the *third* time by obtaining the approval of his advisor.
2. A student may drop a course before mid-term (April 25) by obtaining a drop card from the instructor and presenting it for approval to the director of the school in which he is registered.
3. A student may withdraw from the college by advising the Dean in writing. Failure to give official notice of withdrawal will result in a grade of "F" in each course for which the student was registered.
4. *All* women students must have the Dean of Women's notation that place of residence is approved.

VETERANS

1. Clear your entrance requirements with the registrar.
2. Go to the office of the Veterans Coordinator in the Student Center. He will certify your eligibility and direct you to the Registrar or to the school with which you are affiliated.
3. Turn in your registration material to Mr. Davis immediately upon completion of your registration.

*To meet certification requirements, a student enrolling in Education 381 must at some time enroll in Education 391. A student with credit in Education 391 will register a special methods course in a second field of study as Education 392. Education 382 is open only to a student who has not had and is unable to obtain or schedule a methods course in his field of concentration before graduation, and who has arranged for a one-hour conference period each week with the chairman of the department preparing him in his content field. A student with credit in Education 416 or Education 426, will register the second student teaching course as Education 417, or Education 427, respectively; a third course would be registered as Education 418 or Education 428, if at the same grade level of teaching. Education 419 (formerly Education 418) is open only to the student with senior standing who has credit in Education 382 or is enrolled in the course. The student who plans to enroll in student teaching courses during the Fall Quarter of 1952-53 must have his application approved not later than May 1, 1952 by the Chairman of the Department of Education, the Chairman of the Department concerned with training in the content field, and by the Director of Student Teaching.

**The courses whose numbers are preceded by "S" indicate graduate courses open to advanced undergraduate students who lack only forty-eight quarter hours credit toward graduation and who meet the prerequisite requirements indicated in the catalogue.
