REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

- Step 1. Pick up registration material beginning December 3.
- Step 2. Plan a tentative course of study and have it approved by your advisor.
- Step 3. Pay your registration fee beginning December 10.
- Step 4. Get your instructors' approval of your courses beginning 8:00 A.M. December 14 or 15.
- Step 5. After all courses have been approved by your instructors leave your official registration card with the Director of your school or with the Dean. You keep the "student's copy" of the blue cards.

Note: *Late Registration Fee*—An extra fee of \$1.00 will be charged for *each day* after the first day classes are scheduled to meet.

1. A student may cancel or add a course before it has met the *third* time by obtaining the approval of his advisor.
2. A student may drop a course before mid-term (Feb. 9) by obtaining a drop card from the instructor and presenting it for approval to the director of the school in which he is registered.
3. A student may withdraw from the college by advising the Dean in writing. Failure to give official notice of withdrawal will result in a grade of "F" in each course for which the student was registered.
4. *All* women students must have the Dean of Women's notation that place of residence is approved.

2. Get your matriculation material from the office of the Veterans Coordinator in the Student Center.
3. After you have obtained final approval of your registration card return it to the Veterans office.

*To meet certification requirements, a student enrolling in Education 381 must at some time enroll in Education 391. A student with credit in Education 391 will register a special methods course in a second field of study as Education 392. Education 382 is open only to a student who has not had and is unable to obtain or schedule a methods course in his field of concentration before graduation, and who has arranged for a one-hour conference period each week with the chairman of the department preparing him in his content field. A student with credit in Education 416 or Education 426, will register the second student teaching course as Education 417, or Education 427, respectively; a third course would be registered as Education 418 or Education 428, if at the same grade level of teaching. Education 419 (formerly Education 418) is open to the student with senior standing who has credit in Education 382, or is enrolled in the course. The student who plans to enroll in student teaching courses during the spring quarter of 1951-52 must have his application approved not later than February 1, 1952—by the Chairman of the Department of Education, the Chairman of the Department concerned with training in the content field, and by the Director of Student Teaching. Do you expect the Education 391 courses listed above to be offered again this year.
