REGISTRATION:

June 6—8:00 to 12:00—Current students only. Students who were in residence during the Spring Semester, 1955.

June 6—1:00 to 4:00—For Summer Session applicants whose surnames begin with A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, or J.

June 7—8:00 to 12:00—For Summer Session applicants whose surnames begin with K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, S, T, U, V, W, X, Y, or Z.

June 7—1:00 to 3:00—Graduate Registration only.

June 8 —Classes meet as scheduled.

July 13 —Examinations—First Term Ends.

July 14 —Classes meet as scheduled.

August 19—Examinations—Term ends.

August 20—Informal Commencement—12:00 Noon.

NOTE: Those who advise the registrar of their intentions to register for the Summer Session will have their registration material ready for them when they arrive on the campus. Otherwise they will be delayed while the IBM office prepares their registration material.

Registration Fees:

For residents of Tennessee—8 semester hours or more \$40.00

Non residents of Tennessee—8 semester hours or more 75.00

For residents of Tennessee—less than 8 semester hours \$5.25 per sem. hr.

Non residents of Tennessee—less than 8 semester hours \$9.40 per sem. hr.

Late Registration: An extra fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each day after the first day classes are scheduled to meet.

ADMISSION AND REGISTRATION

1. A student's admission credentials must be on file in the Registrar's office before a matriculation card will be issued.
2. **REGULAR STUDENTS**—A complete official transcript of the high school and college record must be on file for students planning to remain at Memphis State College for more than the Summer Session.

NOTE: A transcript is not necessary for students attending another college and who plan to be at Memphis State for the *Summer Session only*. Instead of a transcript, they should have the registrar send a statement of good standing to the Registrar's office, Memphis State College. The statement should give the student's classification.

3. VETERANS—After your adviser approves your registration packet, go to Mr. Davis and get your veteran's file approved *before* you go to the Bursar.
4. Registration procedure:
 - a. After you pick up your registration packet from Room 206, go to your adviser. He will retain your packet and return one card with your approved program on it. Take this card to the card center and pick up your course cards. Return to your adviser and complete your official material for adviser's approval. Take your approval packet to your Director for final approval before you go to the Bursar.
5. All women students must have the Dean of Women's notation that the place of residence is approved.

CHANGE OF COURSE PROCEDURE

1. ADDING —No first term course may be added after June 10.
No second term course may be added after July 18.
2. DROPPING —No first term course may be dropped after June 17.
No second term course may be dropped after July 22.
3. WITHDRAWAL—A student may withdraw from the college by advising the Dean in writing. Failure to give official notice of withdrawal will result in a grade of "F" in each course for which the student is registered.
