Admission to Graduate School

1. Application blanks for admission to the Graduate School may be secured from the Registrar's office, and all inquiries should be addressed to the Registrar.
2. Admission credentials (application blank and undergraduate transcript) for new graduate students must be on file in the Registrar's Office by May 12, 1961.
3. Qualifying examination for admission to the Summer Term of Graduate School will be given at 9:00 A.M. May 20, 1961. A fee of \$2.00 will be charged for the examination. A pre-registration fee of \$10.00 (no refunds) is required on the day the entrance exam is taken.

Procedure of Registration

1. Registration cards are issued in the Registrar's Office ONLY. (Adm. 204).
2. After securing registration materials, confer with your major adviser, complete materials, and secure signatures of both major and minor advisers.
 NOTE: New graduate students will be assigned major and minor advisers in the Graduate Office (Adm. 203).
3. Secure class cards from Departmental Chairmen.
4. Present all materials to Director of Graduate School.
5. After the registration is approved by the Director, materials must be taken to the Bursar's Office where all fees must be paid. Registration is not complete until all fees are paid.

Graduate School Regulations

1. Twelve semester hours not including inter-session or post-session shall be maximum load for students devoting the full summer to graduate study. Only six semester hours may be registered for during one term of the summer session.
2. After a graduate student has completed his registration, it cannot be changed without approval of the Director of the Graduate School. The adjustment will originate in the office of the Director, and the change-of-course must have the approval of the student's adviser and the Director.

ADDING	—No first term course may be added after June 14. No second term course may be added after July 20.
DROPPING	—No first term course may be dropped after June 21. No second term course may be dropped after July 27. No two-term course may be dropped after June 28.
3. Failure to give official notice of complete withdrawal from Graduate School in writing will result in a grade of "F" in each course for which the student was registered. Address your notice of withdrawal to the Director.

Tuition and Fees

Students may register for both terms of summer school at the first registration period (waiting until the second summer term to select the courses for that term) and pay a total registration fee of \$65.00 for state residents and an additional \$55.00 for out-of-state residents. This option may not be exercised after the initial summer registration period. No refunds will be made after the initial period for refunds.

Students who register for each term separately will pay the regular \$9.00 per semester hour for state residents and an additional \$9.00 per semester hour for out-of-state residents. The graduation fee of \$15.00 is payable 30 days prior to graduation.

FORMER STUDENTS, including those not registered at Memphis State for the 1961 Spring Semester and/or who have attended another college since last attending Memphis State, must clear admission requirements with the Registrar's Office as follows:

1. Complete the application for readmission form provided by the Registrar's Office.
2. Request the registrar of each college attended, if any, to mail a transcript of college credits to the Registrar's Office.
