ADVANCED PACKET PICKUP

for

Current and Former Students

August 19-20—September 4-5-7-8

Advanced packet pick up will be held on August 19-20 and September 4-5, 7 and 8. Former graduate students who complete re-admission requirements by Tuesday, August 11, may obtain their packets on those dates in the Records Office. A former student who does not apply for re-admission by August 11 may not receive his packet before 1:00 P.M. September 26.

The graduate student who has filled out the cards in his packet and had his courses approved by his adviser will go to the Card Center at 1:00 P.M. September 26 and secure his course cards without delay. See the steps in the Registration Procedure on the next page.

Admission to Graduate School

1. An application blank shall be completed and filed with the Dean of Admissions, not later than September 3, 1964, for the Fall term.
2. Two transcripts of undergraduate work shall be on file with the Dean of Admission by September 3. At least one of the transcripts must come directly from the undergraduate institution. (Memphis State University graduates will have transcripts provided.)
3. A score on the Miller Analogies Test shall be on file with the Dean of Admissions. Out-of-State students are encouraged to take the test at an institution near them and to have the scores sent to Memphis State University. Graduate Record Examination scores may be accepted in lieu of the Miller Analogies Test.
4. The Miller Analogies Test will be given in Room 270, Administration Building, by the Testing and Guidance Director at Memphis State University on the following dates: June 26 at 1:30, July 13 at 1:30, August 17 at 1:30, August 25 at 3:00, August 26 at 3:00, September 12 at 8:30 A.M., 10:00 A.M., and 11:30; September 16 at 10:00 A.M. and at 7:00 P.M.
5. A fee of \$2.00 will be charged for the test. It must be paid at the Business Office, 200 Administration Building, prior to the Examination. The receipt is required for admission to the testing room. The Business Office is open from 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. daily except Saturday when it is open 9 A.M. to Noon.
6. The student who must take the test should call or write the Guidance and Testing Office, Room 266, Administration Building, 324-3601, extension 242, to establish a date. Each testing session is limited to 25.
7. The student should arrange an interview with the Dean of the Graduate School, Room 260, Administration Building, as soon as possible after he has met all admissions requirements. His registration may be delayed if the interview has not been arranged prior to Registrations day. Write or call 324-3601 extension 253 for an appointment.

Procedure of Registration

1. Registration cards are issued in the Registrar's Office ONLY. (Adm. 204).
2. After securing registration materials, confer with your major adviser, complete material and secure signatures of both major and minor advisers.
3. Secure class cards and course approval from Departmental Chairmen.
4. Present all materials to the checking station of the Graduate School. (Adm. 374)
5. After the registration is approved by the Dean, materials must be taken to the Bursar's Office where all fees must be paid. Registration is not complete until all fees are paid. **VETERANS:** Request information from the office of the Dean of the Graduate School.
6. Secure a parking permit from the Dean of Men. Parking permits are valid from September 1, 1964 to September 1, 1965.

Graduate School Regulations

1. Sixteen semester hours shall be maximum load for students devoting full time to graduate study. Only full-time students may register for more than twelve semester hours of course work in any one semester, including courses on campus, extension courses, and courses to be transferred from other institutions. Students who have full-time positions may not enroll for more than two courses.
2. After a graduate student has completed his registration, it cannot be changed without approval of the Dean of the Graduate School. The adjustment will originate in the office of the Dean, and the change-of-course must have the approval of the student's adviser and the Dean.

ADDING: —No course may be added after October 2.
DROPPING: —No course may be dropped after October 30.
WITHDRAWAL: —No student may withdraw after January 16.

3. Failure to give official notice of complete withdrawal from Graduate School in writing will result in a grade "F" in each course for which the student was registered. Address your notice of withdrawal to the Dean of the Graduate School.
4. To become a candidate for a degree, the student must file an application on blanks available at the Office of the Dean. The application must contain plans for a complete program of graduate study and be approved by a faculty adviser in both the major and minor areas. Unless "Intent to Graduate" cards are on file by October 23, one cannot be assured of a diploma on January 30, 1965.
5. A student must have an overall B average in graduate courses at the beginning of the semester in order to be placed on the list for graduation in that semester.
