Admission to Graduate School

1. Application blanks for admission to the Graduate School may be secured from the Registrar's Office, and all inquiries should be addressed to the Dean of Admissions.
2. Admission credentials (application, two undergraduate transcripts and entrance examination scores) for new graduate students must be on file in the Registrar's Office by Jan. 20, 1964. All applicants, including Memphis State University graduates, are required to take an entrance examination.
3. Qualifying examinations for admission to Graduate School will be given in Room 270, Adm. Bldg., on December 14, at 9:30 A.M., and Jan. 18 at 8:30 A.M. and 10:00 A.M. Requests to take the examination should be made to the Testing and Guidance Center, Room 266, Adm. Bldg. The telephone number is 324-3601, Ext. 242. Requests to take the examination should be made two weeks in advance of the desired date.
4. A fee of \$2.00 will be charged for the examination and must be paid before one may take the examination. A receipt will be required for admission to the examination. This fee should be paid in the Bursar's Office, 208 Administration Building prior to the time of the examination. Office hours are 8 A.M. to 4 P.M. except Saturday when the hours are 9 A.M. to 12.

Procedure of Registration

1. Registration cards are issued in the Registrar's Office ONLY. (Adm. 204).
2. After securing registration materials, confer with your major adviser, complete materials and secure signatures of both major and minor advisers.
3. Secure class cards and course approval from Departmental Chairmen.
4. Present all materials to the checking station of the Graduate School. (Adm. 374)
5. After the registration is approved by the Dean, materials must be taken to the Bursar's Office where all fees must be paid. Registration is not complete until all fees are paid.
VETERANS: Request information from the office of the Dean of the Graduate School.
6. Secure a parking permit from the Dean of Men. Parking permits are valid from September 1, 1963 to September 1, 1964.

Current Students

1. Students enrolled at Memphis State University during the Fall semester, 1963, will automatically have registration materials prepared for them. It will not be necessary for them to notify the Records Office of their intention to return.
2. Current students may obtain registration materials from the Registrar's Office on January 7-10. Office hours are 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.

Former Students

Former students, including those not registered at Memphis State for the 1963-64 semester and/or who have attended another college since last attending Memphis State, must clear admission requirements with the Registrar's Office as follows:

1. Complete the application for readmission form provided by the Registrar's Office by January 2, 1964.
2. Request the registrar of each college attended, if any, to mail two transcripts of college credits to the Registrar's Office.
3. Students who have notified the Registrar's Office prior to Jan. 2 may obtain registration materials Jan. 7-10. Office hours are 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.

New Students

1. Registration cards for new students will not be available before 10:30 A.M., February 1, in the Registrar's Office. (Adm. 204).
2. New students will not be permitted to register until transcripts have been evaluated at a conference with the Graduate Dean. Advisers will be assigned at that time. (Adm. 260)
3. New students who fail to arrange an interview with the Graduate Dean prior to February 1 may have their registrations delayed until the following week. The interview should be arranged after the student has a score on the entrance examination. Write John Richardson, Dean, for an appointment or call 324-3601, Ext. 253.

Graduate School Regulations

1. Sixteen semester hours shall be maximum load for students devoting full time to graduate study. Only full-time students may register for more than twelve semester hours of course work in any one semester, including courses on campus, extension courses, and courses to be transferred from other institutions. Students who have full-time positions may not enroll for more than two courses.
2. After a graduate student has completed his registration, it cannot be changed without approval of the Dean of the Graduate School. The adjustment will originate in the office of the Dean, and the change-of-course must have the approval of the student's adviser and the Dean.

ADDING: —No course may be added after February 18.

DROPPING: —No course may be dropped after March 17.

WITHDRAWAL: —No student may withdraw after May 16.

3. Failure to give official notice of complete withdrawal from Graduate School in writing will result in a grade "F" in each course for which the student was registered. Address your notice of withdrawal to the Dean of the Graduate School.
4. To become a candidate for a degree, the student must file an application on blanks available at the Office of the Dean. The application must contain plans for a complete program of graduate study and be approved by a faculty adviser in both the major and minor areas. Unless "Intent to Graduate" cards are on file by March 13, one cannot be assured of diploma on May 30, 1964.

Admission to Graduate School
