Beginning May 11 and continuing until noon May 15, registration packets for current and former graduate students who complete re-admission requirements by Monday, April 19, may be obtained in the Records Office. A former student who does not apply for re-admission by April 19 may not receive his packet before 2:00 P.M. June 7.

The graduate student who has filled out the cards in his packet and had his courses approved by his adviser will go to the Card Center at 2:00 P.M. June 7 and secure his course cards without delay. See the steps in the Registration Procedure on the next page.

Admission to Graduate School

1. An application blank must be completed and filed with the Dean of Admissions, not later than May 22, 1965, for the first term of Summer Session, and not later than July 3, 1965 for the second term of Summer Session.
2. Two transcripts of undergraduate work must be on file with the Dean of Admissions. At least one of the transcripts must come directly from the undergraduate institution. (Memphis State University graduates will have transcripts provided.)
3. A score on the Miller Analogies Test must be on file with the Dean of Admissions. Applicants from out of the City are encouraged to take the test at an institution near them and to have the scores sent to Memphis State University. Graduate Record Examination scores may be accepted in lieu of the Miller Analogies Test.
4. The Miller Analogies Test will be given on the Memphis State University campus for out-of-City applicants, in Room 200, Administration Building, by the Guidance and Testing Director on the following dates: Saturday, May 8, at 10:00 A.M.; Saturday, May 22, at 10:00 A.M.; Thursday, May 27, at 3:00 P.M. Prospective students may write for inclusion in the list of 25 accepted for each testing session.
5. Memphis and Shelby County residents should call the Guidance and Testing Office, Room 204, Administration Building, 324-3601, extension 242, for an appointment to take the test.
6. A fee of \$2.00 will be charged for the test. It must be paid at the Business Office, 22 Administration Building, prior to the examination. The receipt is required for admission to the testing room. The Business Office is open from 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. daily except Saturday when it is open 9:00 A.M. to Noon.
7. The student should arrange an interview with the Dean of the Graduate School, Room 21 Administration Building, as soon as possible *after* he has met all admission requirements. His registration may be delayed if the interview has not been arranged prior to Registration Day. Write or call 324-3600, extension 253, for an appointment.
8. Students who are applying for the Fall semester may request later testing dates.

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NOTE: THOSE WHO ARE APPLYING FOR FALL ENTRANCE MUST SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FEE OF FIVE DOLLARS (\$5.00) WITH THE APPLICATION. THIS CHARGE IS A SERVICE CHARGE AND NOT REFUNDABLE.

Procedure of Registration

1. Registration cards are issued in the Records Office ONLY. (Adm. 218).
2. After securing registration materials, confer with your major adviser, complete material and secure signatures of both major and minor advisers.
3. Secure class cards and course approval from Departmental Chairmen.
4. Present all materials to the checking station of the Graduate School. (Study Room-Downstairs Student Center)
5. After the registration is approved, materials must be taken to the Bursar's Office where fees must be paid. Registration is not complete until all fees are paid.
6. Secure a parking permit from the Dean of Men. Parking permits are valid from September 1, 1964 to September 1, 1965.

Graduate School Regulations

1. Twelve semester hours not including inter-session or post-session shall be maximum load for students devoting the full summer to graduate study. Students may register for six semester hours during one term of the summer session. Students who are employed may not enroll for a full load.
2. After a graduate student has completed his registration, it cannot be changed without approval of the Dean of the Graduate School. The adjustment will originate in the office of the Dean, and the change-of-course must have the approval of the student's adviser and the Dean of the Graduate School.

ADDING

- No first term course may be added after June 14.
- No second term course may be added after July 22.

DROPPING

- No first term course may be dropped after June 18.
- No second term course may be dropped after July 29.
- No two-term course may be dropped after June 25.

WITHDRAWAL

- No withdrawal from first term after July 12.
- No withdrawal from second term after August 16.

3. Failure to give official notice of complete withdrawal from Graduate School in writing will result in a grade of "F" in each course for which the student was registered. Address your notice of withdrawal to the Dean of the Graduate School.

Tuition and Fees

Students may register for both terms of summer school at the first registration period (waiting until the second summer term to select the courses for that term) and pay a total registration fee of \$65.00 for state residents and an additional \$55.00 for out-of-state residents. This option may not be exercised after the initial summer registration period. No refunds will be made after the initial period for refunds.

Students who register for each term separately will pay the regular \$9.00 per semester hour for state residents and an additional \$9.00 per semester hour for out-of-state residents. The graduation fee of \$15.00 is payable 30 days prior to graduation.

FORMER STUDENTS

A former student is defined as (1) one who has not registered at Memphis State University during the Spring Semester, 1965, and/or (2) one who has attended another college since he last attended Memphis State. Such a student, in order to qualify for re-admission, must clear the following requirements with the Records Office (Room 218, Administration Building) not later than May 15, 1965.

1. Complete the application form for re-admission provided by the Records Office.
2. Request the registrar of each college attended, if any, to mail a transcript of credits to the Records Office.

After the new applicant or the former student has completed the procedures outlined above he will be notified of his status by the Records Office; if he is accepted, he will be issued a card of admission. **THIS CARD MUST BE PRESENTED AT THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE AT THE TIME REGISTRATION PACKETS ARE OBTAINED.** Failure to comply with admission or re-admission procedures will delay your procurement of registration materials.

CURRENT STUDENTS

Students enrolled at Memphis State University during the Spring Semester, 1965, will have registration materials prepared for them only if they notify the Records Office—Room 218. If the Records Office is notified not later than April 19, 1965, registration materials will be available May 11-15, 1965.

Admission to Graduate School

Application blanks for admission to the Graduate School may be secured from the Dean of Admissions' Office, and all inquiries should be addressed to the Dean of Admissions.
